

# Augmentative and Alternative Communication Unit

Our popular AAC Unit provides a thorough exploration of Augmentative and Alternative Communication systems.



You will explore the needs of individuals with complex communication difficulties and critically evaluate the range of Assistive Technology resources and strategies available.

The course will encourage a thorough analysis of solutions, including issues surrounding assessment, implementation, support and training.

You will consider a client-centred approach and explore the processes and decision making involved in the assessment of individuals who require AAC.

This Unit is a blended learning course which combines four tutor-led days with your own independent study. Throughout the course you will complete a portfolio of tasks and evidence further reading and study. You will also be required to present a short case study based on your work practice and reflecting issues addressed during the course.



On completion of the course, you will receive an AAC Unit Certificate authorised by ACE Centre North.

## Further Qualifications

This course can be accredited with Manchester Metropolitan University (MMU) and awarded 20 CAT points (Credit Accumulation Transfer Points). An additional 20 CAT Point Unit requiring completion of a 4000 word assignment may also be undertaken. Please note this will require registering with MMU and will incur additional fees payable to the University.
